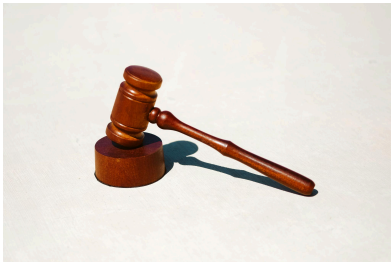


GETTING THE NDIS BACK ON TRACK

UNLAWFUL GOODS, SERVICES AND JUSTICE



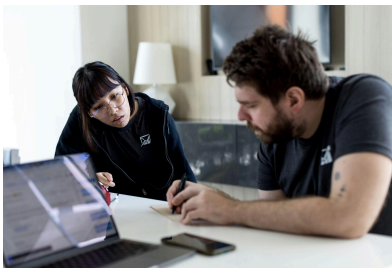
NDIS funding cannot be used for supports, items, or services that are illegal in Australia or don't comply with local laws and standards, including certain technology and modifications.

This restriction extends to costs associated with the legal system which are typically more appropriately funded by the justice system.

The supports listed below are not able to be claimed from your plan.

Illegal Items	Drugs that against a Commonwealth, State or Territory law.
	Firearms and other weapons.
	Items that are prohibited by law in Australia or any state.
	Assistive products, vehicle modifications or home modifications that do not comply with Commonwealth, State or Territory laws, the National Construction Code or mandated Australian standards for the location or purpose the participant will require them
	Supports involving restrictive practices that are not authorised in the participant's state or territory of residence
	Consumable products that are against the law
Justice Supports	Supports in secure mental health facilities which are primarily treatment focused (clinical in nature)
	Supervision and monitoring to prevent or observe offending behaviour or to monitor adherence to justice system-imposed conditions
	The day-to-day care and support needs of a person in custody, including supervision, personal care and general supports
	Pre-sentence psychological and psychiatric reports
	Secure accommodation facilities where the purpose of this accommodation is to safeguard the community or prevent reoffending, including secure mental health facilities.
